

The professionalization of the Educational Services Coordinator What role in the world of work

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INTRODUCTION

In view of the increasing of social enterprises, the European Commission (2020) has undertaken a mapping study (2014-2020) on ecosystems in all EU countries in order to understand the evolution and characteristics of social enterprise activities, professional profiles and skills development, offering an overview of possible future trends in social innovation.

In Italy, the number of workers employed in the sector is 53% (ISTAT, 2020). This result hides the existence of a variety of professionals who design, coordinate, guide, manage and evaluate services aimed at the person (Federighi, 2020). These profiles are required to possess professional knowledge and skills that are both specific and multidisciplinary; a configuration of competences that is general to all professionals, as reflected in the European Skills Agenda and current international developments.

RESEARCH QUESTIONS AND AIM

The research examines the figure of the educational services coordinator in order to understand his professional identity and the role played within social enterprises.

Specific research questions What activities does he/she carry out? With what knowledge? With what skills?
