

Female and Male Depictions in Picturebooks: Non-conventional **Models for Boys and Girls**

State of the art

Children's literature (from picturebooks to novels) selects a different approach when portraying males and females. Men and women are presented as two opposite poles that cannot meet or merge. (Gianini Belotti 1978; Biemmi 2007; Ulivieri 2014).

Women represent a minority and are seldom portrayed as main/active characters. Female depictions are strongly stereotyped and related to a an outdated ideal of beauty, maternity, and/or domesticity (Lopez 2018).

Men are extensively represented from a quantitative perspective, but their depiction is strongly linked to a stereotyped, toxic masculinity.

Aims

- To analyse non-traditional characters (male and female) and their construction from a gender-sensitive perspective;
- To find out new trends in contemporary children's literature regarding gender models:
- To discover which gender-related stereotypes persist in nonconventional texts and what can be done to deconstruct them through words and images.



Literary sample

Method

- Picturebooks (p.b.) for 3-8 years-old children (Faeti 1972; Nodelman 1990)
- National/international p.b. published in Italy
- Contemporary works (last twenty years)
- P.b. redefining male and female identities

Tools

Semi-structured analysis of the characters based on a research form which investigates and relates:

> General information Textual elements Visual elements
